North Carolina is home to many species of mammals, both native and introduced. The NC Wildlife Resources Commission and the Agapé Center is sponsoring a program that will offer a glimpse of these common but often unseen animals. After a short indoor session that will cover species identification and habitat requirements, participants will explore the Center grounds to observe wildlife in the field, and also search for their tracks, scat, and sign.
